Watchdog to rethink 'junk food' regulations

Controversial advertising rules, which label products including cheese as "junk food", are to be reviewed by the official food watchdog just a month after being introduced.

The regulations were introduced as part of a Government drive against child obesity. They banned advertisements for certain products from children's television.

But the "nutrient profiling" model - which calculates the amount of fat, saturated fat, salt and sugar per 100g of a foodstuff - has been savagely criticised by the food industry and health groups. It is claimed that the system

Trend for online shopping picks up

More goods are being delivered to people's homes after being ordered online, it emerged yesterday.
